Town wide upgrade to Water Meter System

In a continuing effort to improve our water service, the Town of Wrentham is implementing a town wide upgrade to our water metering system. This upgrade includes installation of a new water meter and reading device at homes and businesses by the installation contractor, Hydro Utilities. This installation is mandatory and will be at no additional charge to for a standard installation. Hydro Utilities will provide a dedicated number 866-983-8080 and website wrenthammeters.com for scheduling water meter replacements. Starting in March, all water users should receive letters in the mail outlining the program and directions for scheduling water meter replacement.
