Each year, the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education identifies a small number of Schools of Recognition based on the results of the annual Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS). Roderick School was one of the fifty-seven schools selected in 2024, out of a total of 1,827 elementary schools in Massachusetts. This is an outstanding achievement for the students, teachers, staff members, administrators, and families of Roderick School. It is also a testament to the excellent work done at Delaney School, since the Roderick students learned key concepts and skills in preschool through grade 3. This is one of the many reasons why Wrentham Public Schools is an exceptional school district.

At the September 17th Select Board meeting, the Board voted to increase the Senior Work abatement amount form \$1,000 to \$1,500 a year for up to 100 volunteer hours of search and to set the hourly rate at \$15/hour.

During 2024, the Town of Wrentham received funds from the Massachusetts Opioid Abatement Settlement fund. A total of \$46,729 in funds were allocated by the Town in support of applicants' prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery efforts. The following groups applied to the Town and were awarded Opioid Funds: Safe Coalition \$26,479, Gilly's House \$7,250, Trinity Episcopal Church \$3,000, and King Philip and Wrentham Schools \$10,000.

Wrentham elected and appointed officials will be hosting a forum on MBTA Communities, the forum will be recorded on November 13th and broadcast shortly thereafter. The Town of Wrentham is aware of other public forums being held by groups throughout town. The Town is committed to providing accurate, fair and balanced information about the MBTA requirements and requested zoning bylaw change. This will be the only official Town-moderated panel discussion on the topic.

The Planning Board closed the Public Hearing for the Zoning Bylaw on November 6th and have prepared a Multi-family Overlay District Zoning Bylaw that's available now.

Lead Service Line Surveys will be sent out to select residents starting November 15th with instructions for next steps. This survey is federally mandated survey of all customer service pipe materials. The goal of this program is to identify lead components of the drinking water system.

SWEATT PARK UPDATE

Town of Wrentham has officially accepted a bid from Argus Construction to begin work on the long-anticipated renovation of Sweatt Park. The planned park improvements will include muchneeded updates such as demolition and grading, site preparation and the installation of area drains, benches, concrete walkways, newly renovated stairs, renovated tennis courts, four new pickleball courts, added parking spaces and a variety of other park amenities. Improvements will also include the reconfiguration of pathways to preserve the roots of 100-year-old trees in the area. These upgrades will create a more accessible, inviting and enjoyable environment for residents and visitors.

PUBLIC SAFETY

FIRE SAFETY TIPS:

- Remember that open burning is prohibited statewide through January and from May 15th through January 15th in Wrentham.
- Refrain from outdoor cooking and heating. Sparks and embers from chimineas, fire pits, and grills can easily ignite dry vegetation, debris, and overhanging branches.
- Use caution with lawnmowers, leaf blowers, all-terrain vehicles, and other power equipment. The engines can become hot enough to ignite dry leaves and grass.
- Dispose of ashes from fireplaces and wood stoves in a metal can, douse them with water, and cover them with a tight-fitting lid.
 These ashes can remain hot enough to ignite combustibles long after the fire goes out: never dump them outdoors or in the trash.
- Extinguish smoking materials in a sturdy ashtray with water or sand. Never toss cigarette butts, matches, or other smoking materials over the edge of a balcony, stub them out on stairs or railings, or toss them in dry vegetation or debris.


